

## **Klaus Jacob**

Dr. Klaus Jacob is research director of the Environmental Policy Research Centre (FFU) and has been a senior research fellow at FFU since 1995. He holds a diploma in political science of the Freie Universitaet Berlin and obtained his doctorate in 1998 with a thesis on innovation effects in chemicals policy. With a strong background in institutional analysis, innovation theories and methodologies of policy analysis he now concentrates on the integration of environmental concerns into other sectoral policies, on tools and methods for policy assessment, and innovation-friendly environmental policies. He is chairman of the Environmental and Global Change Committee of the German Association of Political Science, has been chair of the 2003 and 2004 Berlin Conferences on the Human Dimensions of Global Environmental Change and is member of the Executive Committee of the FFU. He is also an associate lecturer at the Otto-Suhr-Institute, Department for Political and Social Sciences of the Freie Universitaet Berlin where he teaches courses on policy studies and comparative policy analysis. Klaus Jacob manages the research projects of the FFU and has been working as a project manager in a number of international and national projects since 1995. Projects, among others, have been the "Greening of Industrial Policies", "Lead-Markets for Environmental Innovations", "POINT 3D - Integration of Sustainability Targets into Sectoral Policies", "The Environmental Dimension of Impact Assessment" and "Indicators and Quantitative Tools for Sustainable Development - I.Q.Tools". He has published widely in international and national journals, has been occasionally a reviewer to several journals in political science studies and is a renowned expert for environmental policy analysis and the creating of lead markets for environmental innovations. He lives with his daughter in Berlin.
