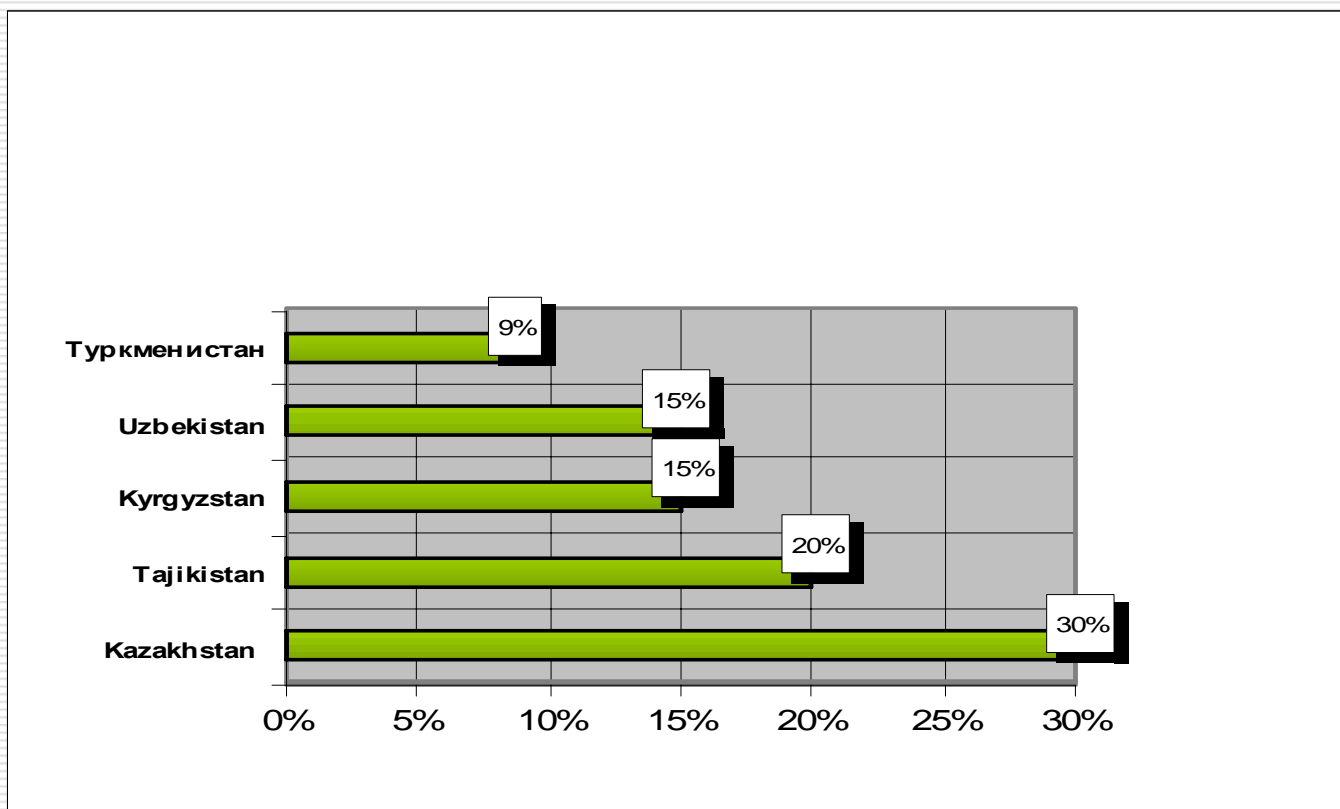

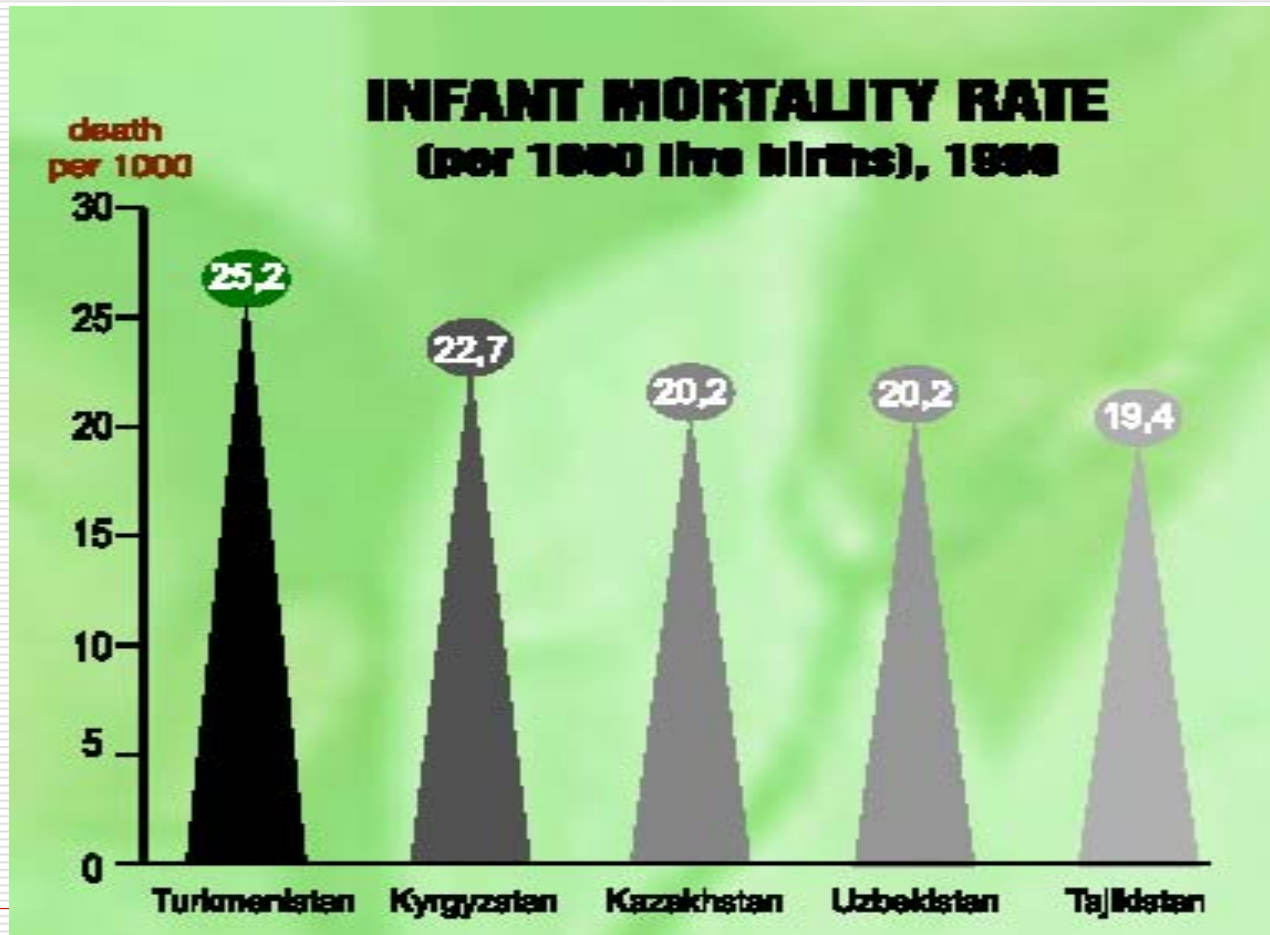
Central Asia region



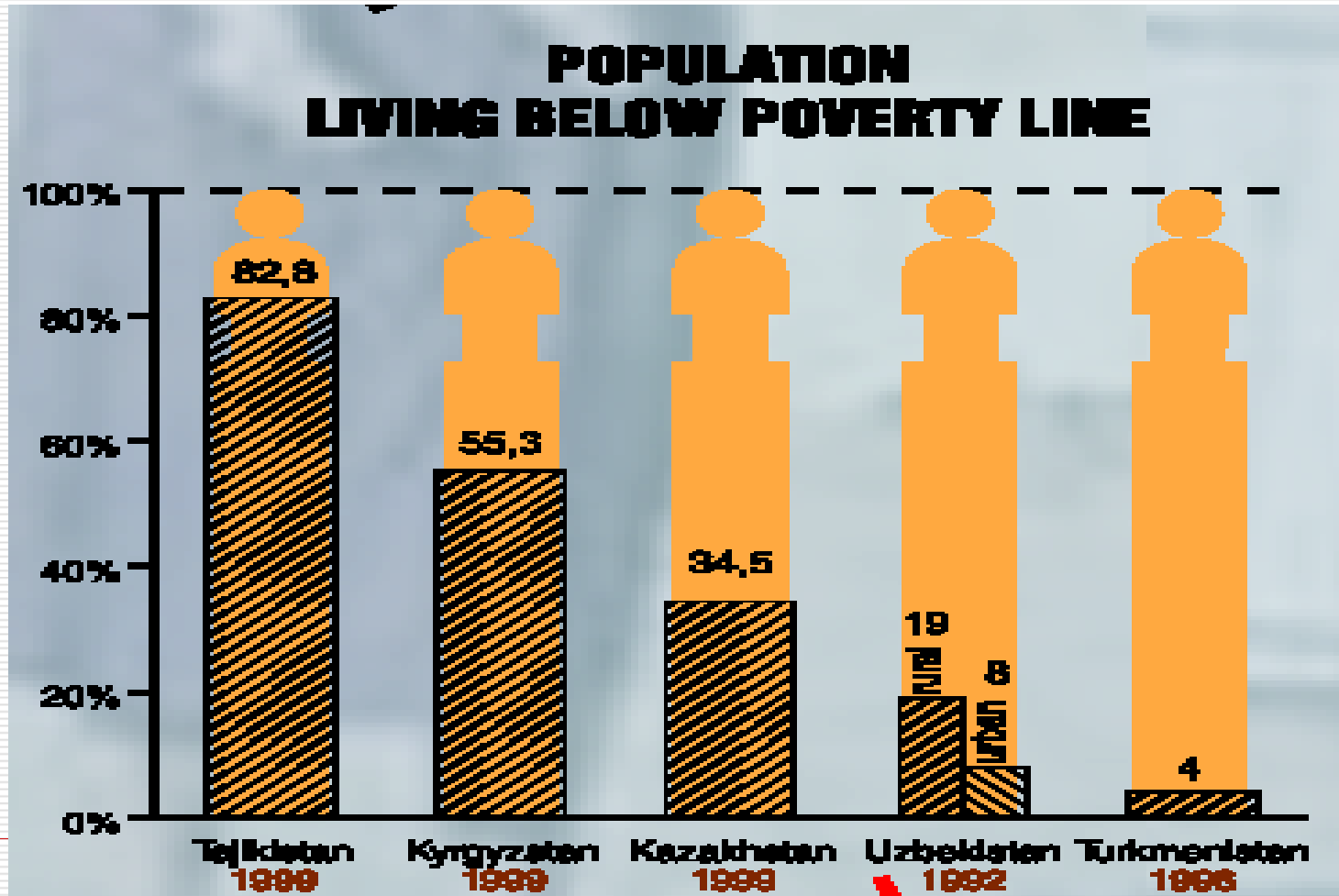
Reduction of arable land (1990-2000)



Infant mortality in Central Asia (2000)



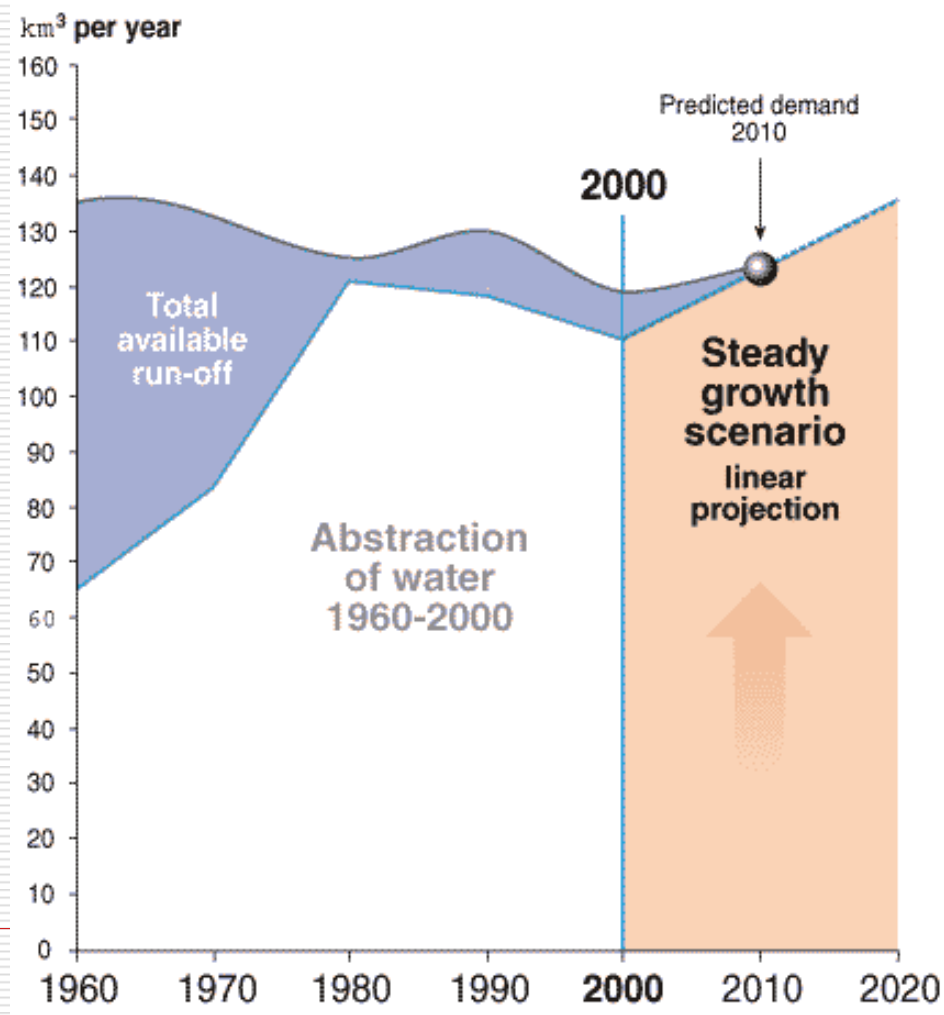
Poverty in Central Asia (2005)

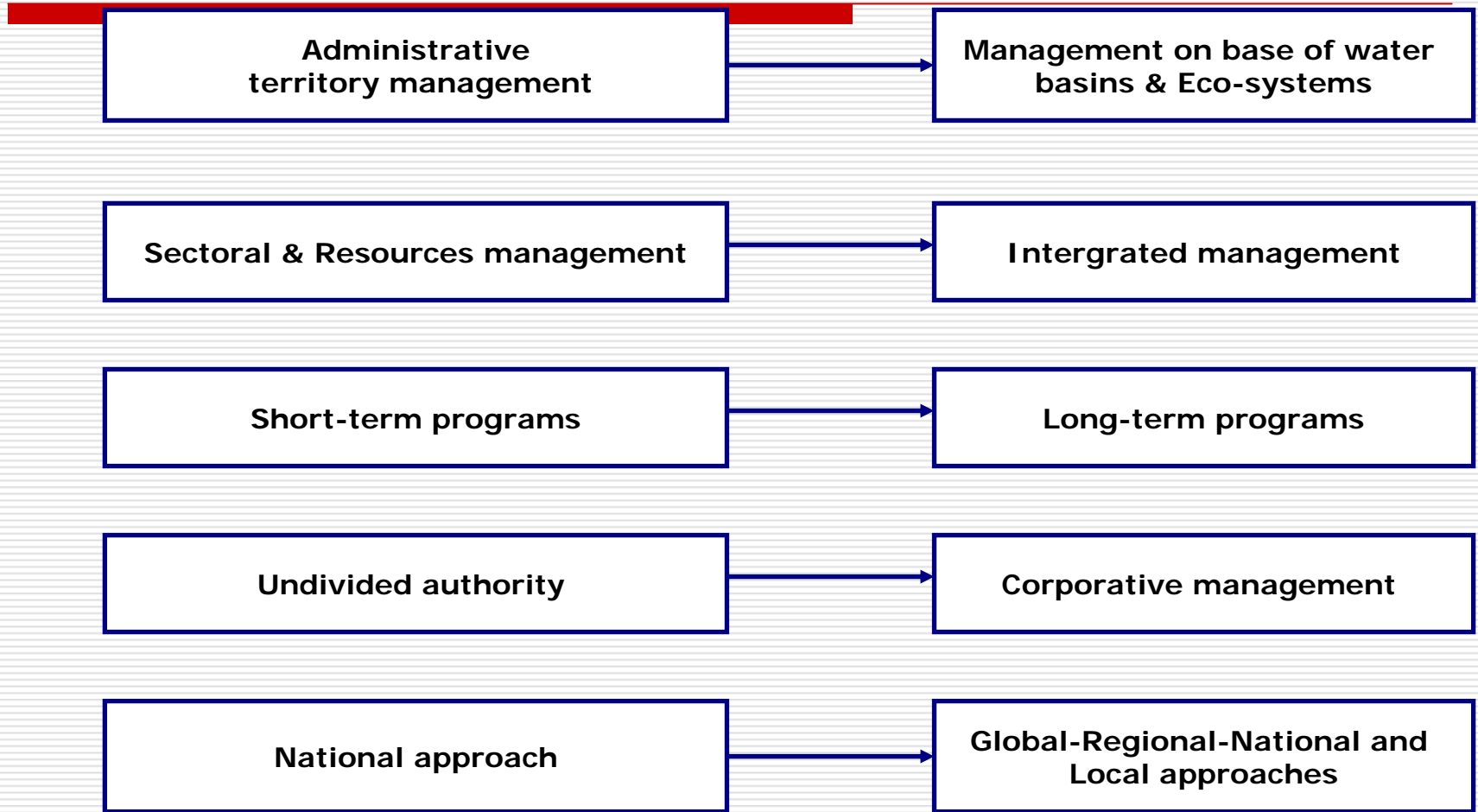
Water conflict in CA (in 2000 it was just a scenario, but now it is a fact)
